The Editors' Awards

International Journal of Hyperthermia is pleased to announce that, commencing in 2007, annual awards will be given for the best papers published in the Journal by young scientists. The Editor's Awards will recognise high-impact research in the Journal's three subject disciplines of clinical, biological and physical studies.

Sponsored by **Taylor & Francis**, three cash prizes of \$750, plus a year's membership to either **Society for Thermal Medicine**, **European Society for Hyperthermic Oncology** or **Asian Society of Hyperthermic Oncology**, will be awarded to the lead author of winning papers in each category, as adjudicated by the Editorial Board.

At the beginning of each year, the Editorial Board will evaluate all articles published in the previous volume, and select winning papers by 15 April.[†] As such, the competition for the awards commences with publication of 22(1) in February 2006.

Recipients of the awards will be notified, and announced in *International Journal of Hyperthermia*.

Criteria

The criteria for selection of papers will include judgement on the following items:

1. Novelty of work.
2. Potential to make impact within the field.
3. Overall quality of paper in terms of organization, figures, tables, appropriate citation of the literature, etc.

Eligibility

To qualify for The Editors' Awards, lead authors must be 35 years or younger at the time of submission. Authors must actively self-nominate their papers for consideration in a covering letter to accompany submission.

Submission guidelines

In preparing manuscripts, please first consult *International Journal of Hyperthermia's* **Instructions for Authors** available from the Journal homepages. Articles to be considered for The Editors' Awards should be clearly indicated as such in the covering letter.

[†]In exceptional circumstances, the Editors reserve the right not to present one or more of the awards in any given year if no articles are considered to have fulfilled the necessary criteria.
